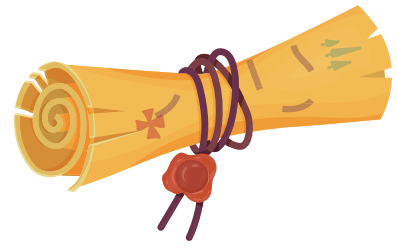
# ELEMENTARY

## WEEK 1: BRAZIL

The Elementary Panel kicks off their first week of camp introducing them to the theme of traveling around the world, starting with the country of Brazil! As campers embark our virtual STEAM Camp plane we will explore the culture of Brazil through their music and art. As well, look at the unique development of transportation, passports, and stamps. As a traveling explorer, campers will have the chance to also look into the power of drones!

## WEEK 3: EGYPT

The Elementary Panel will continue their journey around the world, landing in Egypt in week 3! In addition to studying the unique structure of pyramids, campers will also learn about hieroglyphics, canopic jars, and the process of mummification! Campers will also explore the water collection process, and will have opportunities to apply much of what is taught through hand-on experiences!



## WEEK 2: SOUTH AFRICA

We journey to South Africa in week 2. As we explore its rich culture, campers get to explore the language and the music of the Zulu people. In addition we will look into the 4 notable fabric patterns: Adinkra, Kente, Bogolanfini, and Ankara. Through science we look into the history of plagues and disease in South Africa, and in engineering and technology, we will look into South Africa's expertise in cars and automotives.

## WEEK 4: ITALY

The Elementary Panel will further examine architecture in week 4's destination - Italy! As we journey through this hub of culture, art, music, history, and food, campers will have a blast learning about the Colosseum, the Leaning Tower of Pisa, fine arts, sports cars, and the country's unique topography through the lens of the subjects of STEAM!

## WEEK 5: RUSSIA

Week 5 takes us halfway around the world to Russia! This nature-rich country provides an opportunity for campers to learn about different ecosystems, animals and natural resources! This vast country's countless civilizations will also lead campers into exploring technology and engineering through advancements in space and in the intricate metro systems, while iconic symbols like matryoshka dolls and ballet will be presented through art and music.

## WEEK 7: AUSTRALIA

What makes Australia unique amongst other countries is its beauty in both natural and man-made creations. Of the many bridges found around the world, Sydney Harbour Bridge is one of the finest known to man. Campers get to experience the wonders of God's creation and how man can steward and cultivate beauty in the things of this world.

## WEEK 6: JAPAN

Japan is one of the monumental spots to visit. In Japan, campers will get to experience the vibrant culture ranging from its signature art form of animation, otherwise known as “anime”, its excellent contribution to 21st century video games, and Japan's incredible selfie culture. In science we get to dive into the wonders of instant noodles, its production as well as how it's made.

## WEEK 8: CANADA

For our final destination; home! Canada, a land of vast wilderness, diverse cultures, and rich heritage, Dive into the essence of Canada, by exploring wildlife conservation efforts, Indigenous technological innovations, iconic engineering marvels, breathtaking landscapes depicted through art, the mathematical intricacies of maple syrup production, and the thrill of beloved Canadian winter sports.

# SECONDARY PROGRAMS

## ROBOTICS

This program is designed to introduce students to the exciting world of robotics! Through a combination of hands-on activities, interactive lectures, and team projects, students will explore fundamental concepts in robotics, programming, and engineering. This program aims to foster creativity, problem-solving skills, and teamwork while providing participants with practical experience in designing, building, and programming robots.

Across 8 weeks 4 main topics will be covered, focusing on an introduction to foundational concepts in robotics and programming, an overview of mechanical design and construction, an exploration of sensors and actuators, followed with more advanced programming and project development. Throughout the program, students will engage in a combination of hands-on activities.



## LEADERSHIP

This program aims to empower and equip students with the skills, knowledge, and mindset necessary to become effective leaders in their schools, communities, and beyond. Through a combination of interactive workshops, team-building activities, real-world projects, and mentorship, participants will develop essential leadership skills, explore various leadership styles, and cultivate a sense of responsibility and service towards others.

Each week, a focus will be placed on certain characteristics of leadership. Each characteristic will be studied by examining examples of leaders in both history and the Bible. Students will be encouraged to apply their training through group activities and special events. They will also have the opportunity to develop their own initiative and put their leadership qualities into practice.

# Field Trips (Weeks 1 - 4)

We believe that field trips provide real life situations for first hand information. It serves as a preview of a lesson and for gathering instructional materials. It also supplements classroom instruction to secure definite information for specific lessons. Most importantly, we want to arouse specific interest in materials, objects, places, or processes by going on 8 trips this Summer.

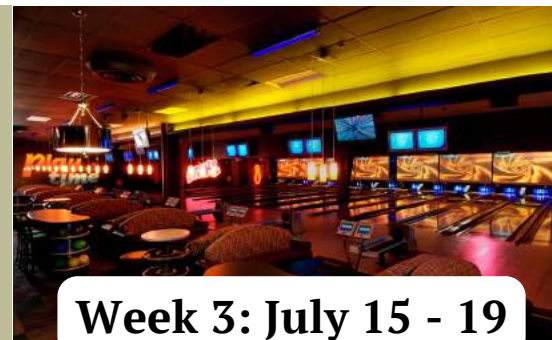

# Health & Safety

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Below are some Health and Safety Protocols for this year:

## Mask NOT Required



Children and staff are not required to be wearing face mask during camp this Summer however, for those with symptoms of the cold, flu, or COVID-19, we would like to encourage them to be wearing a mask while at camp until symptoms subside.

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## Camp Sanitization



Throughout the 8-week duration of camp, we will maintain regular sanitization procedures. Campers and staff will be required to wash their hands upon arrival, before and after meals, and following activities. Additionally, we will ensure the cleaning of tables and chairs.

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## Health Related Sickness & Absences



For any health illness related absences, we will allow campers to attend camp on another week to make up for the missed day. Minimum 72 hours (3 Days) notice required. Only valid for 2024 camp and credits will not be provided for any unused days.
